Kilkenny and Carlow Education and Training Board Statement of System of Internal Control

Responsibility for the System of Internal Control

As Chairperson of Kilkenny and Carlow Education and Training Board (KCETB), I acknowledge the responsibility of the Board for ensuring that an efficient, effective and economic system of internal control is maintained and operated.

In 2018, Kilkenny and Carlow Education and Training Board operated under the Code of Practice for the Governance of ETBs 2015 as adopted on 02 April 2015. The new Code of Practice for the Governance of ETBs 2019 became effective on 30 January 2019 and was adopted by the Board of KCETB on 21 March 2019. KCETB is currently implementing the 2019 Code.

The purpose of the system of internal control is to ensure that assets are safeguarded, transactions are authorised and properly recorded, and that material errors or irregularities are either prevented or would be detected in a timely period.

Key Control Procedures

The Board has taken steps to ensure an appropriate control environment by:

- · Clearly defining management and staff responsibilities;
- Establishing procedures for reporting significant control failures and ensuring appropriate corrective action;
- Establishing procedures for identifying and evaluating risks which could prevent the ETB from achieving its objectives.

The system of internal control operated in KCETB is based on:

- Detailed administrative procedures
- Segregation of duties
- Specific authorisations
- Internal checks
- Monthly management review of reports outlining the actual and budgeted results of programmes operated by the ETB.

The Board's monitoring and review of the effectiveness of the system of internal control is informed by the:

- Work of the Audit and Risk Committee, which considers internal audit reports and reports of the Comptroller and Auditor General (C & AG), and reports to the board whether the Chief Executive is, in its opinion, operating adequate and appropriate systems of internal control;
- Engagement between the Audit and Risk Committee, Finance Committee and Board with the
 executive. The Chief Executive, Director of Organisation Support and Development (OSD),
 Director of Schools and Director of Further Education and Training (FET) reported to the Board in
 2018. The Chief Executive, Director of OSD and Head of Finance reported to the Finance
 Committee in 2018. The Director of OSD, Head of Finance, Head of Human Resources and Head
 of Corporate Services all reported to the Audit and Risk Committee in 2018.

- Chief Executive, who has responsibility for the financial control framework;
- Recommendations made by the C & AG in management letters or other reports;
- Recommendations made by the Internal Audit Unit;

Internal Audit

The Internal Audit function for KCETB is provided by the Internal Audit Unit – Education and Training Boards (IAU-ETB). An Audit on the "Review of the effectiveness of IT system and network availability controls" was submitted to KCETB in 2018. The audit found that KCETB does not have an adequate system of internal control pertaining to both IT systems and Network Management Controls. KCETB has engaged with the Department of Education and Skills (DES), Education and Training Boards Ireland (ETBI) and colleague ETBs in developing appropriate ICT services in the ETB sector. KCETB has emphasised the need for an appropriate ICT service at the ETBI Chief Executive and Director OSD Forums. The Department is aware of requirements and is engaging with ETBI in order to develop a service infrastructure to meet these requirements. KCETB is fully engaged in this process. KCETB has also introduced operational changes to address issues such as system modification recording.

Business Continuity is another element of the ICT Audit Report and is being addressed at national level. The KCETB Director of OSD is a member of the national working group. A Business Impact Assessment is under preparation and will inform a Business Continuity Policy for KCETB. An interim contingency plan has been prepared internally and in conjunction with neighbouring ETBs.

An internal audit on Youthreach was carried out in 2018 and the report is pending.

KCETB would welcome an increase in the resourcing of the Internal Audit Unit in order to provide a more comprehensive and appropriate service.

Public Procurement

KCETB seeks to ensure that there is an appropriate focus on good practice in purchasing and that procedures are in place for compliance with all relevant guidelines.

National policy requires that goods and services are procured by public tender when annual expenditure exceeds €25,000 across the whole organisation. The identification of cumulative procurement issues is being resolved through the introduction of improved processes and procedures as part of preparing a Procurement Plan. During 2018 the amount of identified non-compliant expenditure was €617,349. The threshold was exceeded in a number of areas: HR Agency Services €285,627, following a tendering competition a new contract came into effect in December 2018; Coach Hire €194,403, this matter is being addressed at national level; Contract Cleaning Services €80,459, a new contract will come into effect on 6 August 2019; Printing Services €56,860, a procurement competition will run in 2019.

Single Public Service Pension Scheme

KCETB considers it prudent to report the non – issuance of annual Benefits Calculation and Statement for Members of the Single Public Service Pension Scheme. All ETB's are obliged to furnish such reports under the terms of Circular Letter 11/2014.

Additional resources and technical solutions are required to address this matter which is being discussed between ETBI, Department of Public Expenditure and Reform (DPER) and DES.

A timeline for progressing these matters is not available at present. However the introduction of Shared Services Payroll and HR Systems will partly address this issue and KCETB is scheduled to transition to Shared Services in 2020.

Regulation of Lobbying Act 2015

The Regulation of Lobbying Act 2015 came into effect on 1 September 2015 and provides that certain bodies carrying on lobbying activities must register with the Standards in Public Office Commission. As KCETB did not carry on lobbying activities during 2018, it was not required to register.

Risk Management

A new Code of Practice for the Governance of Education and Training Boards became effective in January 2019. KCETB has already commenced implementing the 2019 code and will update the Risk Register to reflect new provisions in the Code.

KCETB considers it prudent to report that the Department of Social Protection are currently reviewing the rate of PRSI applicable to one employee. It is possible that this case will have financial implications when resolved.

Organisation Design Phase II is a staffing process established by DES as part of the aggregation process, to determine appropriate staffing levels within ETBs for current and future service provision. KCETB has submitted staffing proposals to DES in respect of this process and progress on this will support continued good governance practice and management. Additional funding from DES is currently being employed to respond to specific areas of service demand.

Annual Review of Controls

KCETB is committed to operating an efficient, effective and economic internal control system. At the Audit and Risk Committee meeting in March 2019, a review of the effectiveness of the systems of internal control for the year ended 31 December 2018 was carried out and was based on:

- Review of Audit Register
- Review of previous C & AG audit reports
- Review of risk management
- · Review of staff training
- Review of the C & AG Audit of Financial Statements 2017
- Review of the IAU Audit on "Review of the effectiveness of IT system and network availability controls"
- Review of the effectiveness of the work of the Audit and Risk Committee
- Consultation with the Chairperson of the Finance Committee
- · Review of minutes of the Finance Committee
- The Audit and Risk Committee met with officials from the C&AG in February 2019
- Confirmation provided by Chief Executive to the Board that the system of internal control, including risk management and corporate governance, is in place.

In addition, the system of internal control was kept under review on an ongoing basis having regard to the findings of the most recent internal audits and comments made by the Comptroller and Auditor General in his management letters.

Financial Statements - Year Ended 31st December 2018

Establishment of the Education and Training Board and the Accounting Policies

1 Establishment of the Education and Training Board

Kilkenny and Carlow Education and Training Board was established on 1 July 2013 and its functions are set out in section 10 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

2 Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Presentation

The financial statements are presented in the form approved by the Minister for Education and Skills with the consent of the Minister for Finance and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform. They consist of a Statement of Accounting Policies, an Operating Statement, a Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities and notes to the financial statements.

Where necessary, the comparative figures for the previous year have been reclassified on the same basis as those for the current year.

(b) Basis of Preparation

The Operating Statement presents Receipts and Payments by Programme Grouping and the resultant Cash Surplus / (Deficit) is adjusted for other debtor and creditor movements to determine the overall result for the period on an accrual basis.

The Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities is prepared on the accruals basis by determining state grant and other funder balances at amounts that reflect the related expenditure incurred in accordance with the funding rules.

Third Party Debtors are included in Current Assets. Pay and Expense Liabilities are included in Current Liabilities.

(c) Tangible fixed assets

All assets purchased including land and buildings, fixtures and fittings and training equipment are expensed in the year of purchase. State grants to fund the purchase of tangible fixed assets are recognised in the same year.

(d) Stocks

All consumable stocks are expensed as purchased.

(e) Superannuation

The pension entitlements of ETB staff, including those who transferred from SOLAS, are conferred under defined benefits schemes. Superannuation deductions made from employees pay in respect of the schemes are retained by the ETB as part of agreed Exchaquer funding, or paid over to the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform.

The ETB does not make any contributions towards the schemes.

These unfunded schemes are operated on a pay as you go basis with the annual pension entitlements being paid by the National Shared Services Office on behalf of the ETB. ETBs are responsible for the administration of their pensions. Pension funds are provided by the Department of Education and Skills.

Provision has not been made in the financial statements for the present cost of the future benefits that have accrued to staff members and existing pensioners under these schemes.

(f) Lease Rentals

All lease rentals are expensed as incurred.

Post-Primary Schools and Head Office Pay and Non-Pay grants are funded by the Department of Education and Skills having regard to anticipated income from other sources. In the case of Non-Pay, a shortfall in income that leads to excess expenditure gives rise to a deficit. Excess income is due to the Department and is not considered part of the current year grant funding - in 2018, income exceeds the anticipated receipts by C243,195.

Post-Primary Schools and Nead Office Pay Grant awarded was expected to be funded by direct receipts from the grantor of C1,744,599 and retained superannuation deductions of C1,543,607 (C13,63) more than anticipated) and are included in receipts from the Department of Education and Shills in Note 1 - Schools & Head Office Receipt.

Total grants are set by reference to anticipated expenditure. In the case of Post-Primary Schools and Head Office Non-Pay, and in certain Further education programmers expenditure limits are set. Expenditure incurred in excess of this limit gives rise to a deficit, whereas savings can be retained and used to fund future deficits. In 2018, non-pay expenditure exceeds the limit by (41,414.

The difference between the total amount paid directly by State Departments/offices of C38,233,370 above and the total in Note 11 - Analyzes of Receipts by Funder of C39,790,977 is represented by the Superannuation retained of C1,557,607.
