6. Chief Executive's Report

Chief Executive Eileen Curtis presented the Chief Executive's report:

6.1 Corporate Governance and Administration

Student Enrolment

Following completion of the October Returns to the DE and SOLAS both the second level student enrolment for the academic year 2024/25 and the number of FET starters/beneficiaries



was noted. In addition, it was also noted that over 300 apprentices have registered with an employer in the KCETB area.

School and Centre Annual Report 2023/24

This report was circulated to members in advance and provided an overview of the work which took place in schools and centres throughout the year.

FET Matters

- The purchase of the FET College site in Kilkenny was noted as a major milestone for KCETB as was receipt of permission to proceed to the next stage with the Pre-Tender – Project Design, Planning and Procurement Strategy. Grateful thanks were extended to the board for their support for the project and to all staff involved in bringing the proposal to this stage.
- It was outlined that the FET budget expenditure for 2024 is expected to exceed the allocation to KCETB and that discussions with SOLAS regarding the matter are ongoing.
- A Strategic Dialogue meeting is scheduled to take place with SOLAS on 27 November to discuss budgets, targets and forecasts.

Retirement Function

A function to recognise the service of retired staff took place on 14 November in Carlow to acknowledge the contribution of staff to KCETB. Over the past year 24 members of staff have retired from service. Members extended their gratitude to retiring staff for their dedicated service.

Board Members Guide to Good Governance

The guide was included in the Induction Pack and sets out the key pieces of legislation and codes which govern the ETB. It also outlines the corporate governance structure, the role and functions of the board as well as the role and expectations of board members. A presentation on aspects of the guide was provided by the CE.

Ukrainian Update

Enrolment figures were provided as was a full update on KCETB services and networking with other agencies in the provision of services to Ukrainian and other international protection refugees. The REALT Steering Group continues to meet.



6.2 Schools

Director of Schools Pauline Egan presented the following report:

Teaching and Learning

- The fourth Annual TEACH MEET, a professional learning and sharing event took place virtually on 24 October. Our keynote speaker this year was Dr. Diarmaid Hyland (Maynooth University) who presented on 'Lesson Study as a mode of professional learning in the post primary classroom'. 336 teachers attended the event.
- All schools are currently offering places for enrolment for 2025/26 as part of the Admissions Process. Some schools have moved to an online application process through LetsEnrol.school.
- The Final Induction for New Teachers is being delivered by Dr. Joe O'Connell on 27
 November. The theme of this session is Effective Communication and Building Positive
 Relationships in the school community.
- The middle leader support programme in building leadership capacity is underway in some schools and this is being supported by Dr. Joe O'Connell.
- Student Councils Training for Student Councils promoting and supporting student voice and leadership takes place on 19 and 21 November in Carlow and Kilkenny respectively. Students together with their link teachers will be in attendance.
- ETBI Ethos Project The first meeting of 2024/25 for the Professional Learning Network took place on 14 November organised by the Ethos Co-ordinator. Dr Ann Marie Kavanagh from DCU presented on "Supporting Teachers to Affirm Social Class and Cultural Diversity".
- **SEN Provision Mapping** 4 further schools are engaged in the ETBI provision mapping with Dr. Johanna Fitzgerald this year as follows:

Coláiste Cois Siúire, Coláiste Pobail Osraí, Grennan College and Kilkenny City Vocational School.

- The Induction/Launch of the Programme took place on 01 October with school leaders and their inclusion leads in attendance.
- Linda Mc Cormack is our Inclusion Co-ordinator for the project.

SEN – The first Community of Practice for 2024/25 took place for SENCOs on 07 November. The theme for the event was *'Effective Methods for Sharing Student Data for Collaborative Purposes'*.

 11 teachers are involved in a Community of Practice for Integrating Restorative Practices training into our professional practice which began on 17 October.



A fifth iteration of the Certificate in Restorative Practice (level 8) for teachers will run in Spring 2025.

Teaching and Learning Workshops

- A refresher workshop on the Magenta Principles took place on 05 November. The workshop was delivered by Mike Hughes. 27 teachers attended.
- The ETBI Induction for newly appointed principals and deputies took place on 08 and 09
 October. Our four newly appointed deputy principals were in attendance.

6.3 Further Education and Training

Director of Further Education and Training Martha Bolger presented the following report:

Capital

Site/FET College: Contracts have been exchanged and the sale has been completed and further correspondence will issue from DFHERIS/SOLAS regarding progression to the next stage.

Purcellsinch: The extension to Purcellsinch is complete and phase 2 Apprenticeship classes have commenced.

EOIs for work at Grennan Mill and College of FET (Ormonde) are awaiting appraisal by SOLAS.

Recruitment: Recruitment for a Training Services Manager is ongoing.

Barbara Behan has been appointed to the post of ALO in Kilkenny.

A Strategic Dialogue meeting is scheduled with SOLAS, focusing on budgets, targets, provision and forecasts for the next number of years.

Teaching and Learning

PLC Census: An audit sample of registered PLC learners in both Carlow Institute of Further Education and Training and College of FET Kilkenny has been completed and the PLC numbers confirmed.

Apprenticeship: Registrations for all craft and 2016 + apprenticeships were high again this year. 324 new apprentices have been registered to date with the craft apprenticeships proving most popular.

Commis Chef Capstone Event: A tremendous culinary event took place in Gowran Park on 23 October where apprentices designed and cooked and served a 7-course tasting menu as part of their assessment.

Adult Literacy for Life Research: This research project seeks to identify perceptions of stigma amongst statutory/NGO and other actors who encounter individuals with unmet literacy, numeracy and digital literacy needs, including but not limited to, for example, Department of Social Protection, Health Service Executive, education and training providers, and employment support agencies including the Local Area Employment Service (LAES) etc. The research project will include a range of these statutory/NGO and other stakeholders across Kilkenny and Carlow.

The requirement for this research has been identified and highlighted by members of the Kilkenny and Carlow Regional Literacy Coalition. Each coalition has responsibility for developing a Regional



Literacy Action Plan which reflects the agreed action framework for addressing local and regional literacy, numeracy and digital inclusion needs. This project, which seeks to explore, understand and identify barriers to engagement is the first step in the development of adult literacy antistigma campaign and working towards an inclusive society. The findings from this research project (Phase 1) will inform the development of resources in Phase 2 of the anti-stigma campaign.

This research is being funded by SOLAS - Adult Literacy for Life

SPA Targets: (Up to 30 September 2024)

8. Board Review of Effectiveness

Section 4 of the Code of Practice for the Governance of ETBs 2019 stipulates that the "Board should undertake a self-assessment annual evaluation of its own performance". It further stipulates that the evaluation should be completed every 2-3 years. Previous boards have agreed to conduct self-evaluations every year as a matter of best practice governance.

The Director of the IAU-ETBs has recommended that the Board should be operational for at least a year to provide for an effective self-evaluation. It is proposed that the first self-evaluation of the current Board is scheduled for September 2025. This was agreed.

9. Risk Management

1. Health and Safety

a. A Health and Safety Consultant is continuing to work with Corporate Services to ensure the effective operation of the H&S Management System.

2. Cyber Security

 a. Cyber Security is a significant risk and the new Assistant Principal Officer in Corporate Services will facilitate the development of enhanced ICT and ISMS services for KCETB.

3. OCAG Audit 2023

a. The Audit Management Letter on AFS 2023 identified only two risks and both have a low-risk rating. These will be followed up.

4. Internal Audit

a. The opening meeting for the Associated/Targeted Grants took place with the IAU -ETBs on 5 November 2024.

5. Pensions

- a. KCETB Pensions are administered and paid by the National Shared Services Office (NSSO).
- b. Education Shared Business Services (ESBS) are a business unit in the Department of Education and are in the process of taking over the administration and payment of pensions in the ETB sector.
- c. Some cases of inaccurate payments to ETB pensioners nationally have been identified with six cases relating to KCETB.
- d. Discussion is ongoing at national level between the DE and DPER regarding these.

6. Service Plan Update - Finance 2024

- a. The FET budgets for ETBs are primarily provided by SOLAS.
- b. The provision for 2024 from SOLAS did not provide for anticipated additional services and costs as per our submission:
 - Learner Allowances



- o ESOL
- Increased PLC teaching numbers
- Nationally agreed salary costs
- Apprenticeships
- c. The matter has been continuously discussed between all ETBs and SOLAS.
- d. SOLAS confirmed, at a financial briefing on 5 November, that they are not in a position to provide supplementary funds.
- e. They have requested ETBs to continue the provision of services to the highest possible level within current cashflow to the end of 2024.
- f. The estimated impact on the KCETB FET budget for 2024 was outlined and discussed as were mitigation measures.

10. (b) Report from ETBI Reserve Members Forum

No meeting of ETBI Reserve Members Forum had taken place since the previous meeting of the board.

10. (c) Report from Finance Committee

A virtual meeting of KCETB Finance Committee took place on 8 October 2024.

The meeting was the first meeting of the new Finance Committee and focused on the acquisition of the FET College site at Joinersfolly, Kilkenny.

A written Summary Report on the FET College Proposal was provided to the Committee.



The Chief Executive and Director of FET detailed the background and process for the establishment of a FET College in Kilkenny, and the current proposal to acquire a greenfield site adjacent to Kilkenny City.

Members discussed the report and expressed their satisfaction with the rationale, analysis, due diligence and thorough process which had been undertaken.

Assurance was sought from the Executive by the Committee:

- i. The correct process was applied to the acquisition of the site and complied with all regulatory and best governance practice.
- ii. Funding agencies are satisfied that the acquisition process complies with all regulatory and best governance practice.
- iii. Zoning is appropriate in the context of the acquisition of the site in the absence of planning permission.

The Executive provided assurances:

- i. The Executive confirmed that all regulatory and best governance practice was exercised in the acquisition of the site.
- ii. The Executive confirmed that SOLAS and DFHERIS approved the transaction and carried out their own due diligence to ensure that all regulatory and best governance practice was exercised in the acquisition of the site to their satisfaction.
- iii. The Executive confirmed that the site was being acquired in the absence of planning permission but following discussions with Kilkenny County Council who have confirmed that the purpose of the facility complies with the current zoning of the site. Kilkenny County Council have confirmed their support in principle for the development of a FET College at the site.

Members congratulated the executive on a worthy initiative which is of major benefit to KCETB, complies with good governance and represents value-for-money.

Members agreed unanimously that the acquisition of the site would be recommended to the Board and expressed their hope that the matter could be finalised in the short term.

A further meeting of the Finance Committee was scheduled for 13 November 2024.

10. (d) Report from Audit and Risk Committee

A virtual meeting of KCETB Audit and Risk Committee took place on 8 October 2024.

A written Summary Report on the FET College Proposal was provided to the Committee. The Chief Executive and Director of FET detailed the background and process for the establishment of a FET College in Kilkenny, and the current proposal to acquire a greenfield site adjacent to Kilkenny City.

Members discussed the report and expressed their satisfaction with the rationale, analysis, due diligence and thorough process which had been undertaken.

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Members congratulated the executive on a worthy initiative which is of major benefit to KCETB, complies with good governance and represents value-for-money.

Members agreed unanimously that the acquisition of the site would be recommended to the Board and expressed their hope that the matter could be finalised in the short term.
